The purpose of this scholarship is to encourage students to see and achieve their vision for ministry or marketplace leadership.

Eligibility

The applicant

- Must have a need for financial assistance
- Must be enrolled for 6 or more semester hours in an Associate's or Bachelor's or Master's degree (not for Audit nor CNA Program)
- Must be in good academic standing (Satisfactory Academic Progress SAP)

Selection Process

A maximum of \$1,000 may be awarded to students in a given academic year, disbursed evenly across the Fall and Spring semesters. There may be a single recipient or multiple recipients. Scholarship applications will be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee and conclude with a final interview between the student and the generous donor. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Application Requirements

Pacific Rim Christian University must receive all the following materials by July 31st of each year:

- 1. This completed Application Form
- 2. One Letter of Recommendation (ministry/character references, non-family member)
- 3. A 500-1000 word essay (include a heading, Font 12, Times New Roman) on your calling, giftedness, commitment to serve the community, and personal ministry vision.
